California Adult Education Program Updates and Deliverables

- MOUs and Award Letters for 19/20 CAERC Fund E
 - Memoranda of Understanding (MOU) for the Capital Adult Education Regional Consortium's Fund E, program year 2019-2020, were e-mailed to members on July 10, 2019.
 - o As of today CAERC has received 8 signed MOUs.
 - o There has been no news regarding when the state will release the funds for 2019-20.
- 17/18 and 18/19 Member Expense Report (Q4) is due in NOVA September 1, 2019. The consortium must certify the report by September 30, 2019.
- July 1, 2018 to June 30, 2019 instructional hours and expenses by program area (estimates only) are due in NOVA September 1, 2019.
 - O Due to staffing issues at member agencies, CAERC may have to re-open the program budget for a few members to input their numbers. Members who have already submitted their numbers will not have to re-submit.
- 19/20 Member Program Year Budget and Work Plan is due in NOVA September 30, 2019. The consortium must certify the plan by October 30, 2019.
 - O Due to staffing issues at member agencies, CAERC may have to re-open the program budget for a few members to input their numbers. Members who have already submitted their numbers will not have to re-submit.
- 19/20 Student Data in TOPSPro Enterprise for Q1 is due October 30, 2019.
- 19/20 Q1, including 18/19 carryover, member expense report due in NOVA December 1, 2019. The consortium must certify the report by December 31, 2019.
- July 1, 2018 to June 30, 2019 instructional hours and expenses by program area (actuals) are due in NOVA December 1, 2019. The consortium must certify by December 31, 2019.

CTE and Workforce Preparation Offerings by CAERC in 2019-20

• Sacramento City USD recently went through re-accreditation and will find out the results soon. They currently offer CTE courses in Medical Assisting, Nursing Assisting, and Court Reporting, among others. By January they hope to add Phlebotomy and Veterinary Assisting. Currently they are working on a

- San Juan USD offers Medical Assisting combined with Medical Terminology
 through their IET program. Coding and Medical Terminology and Dental Assisting

- Folsom Cordova USD offers many CTE courses including Welding, Office Technician, QuickBooks, and Instructional Assistant. This year they will also offer a new Customer Service course. By January they hope to partner with Folsom Lake College to offer Early Childhood Education (ECE) credits. Update from LRCCD: New Web Site and Career Education

Fund D Additional Funds

- As CAERC closed out the 18-19 Fund D Quarter 4 books for consortium-level expenses, it was established that there is an excess of approximately \$90,000 that needs to be spent by the end of the calendar year following the consortium's Shared Fiscal and Budget Agreement Policy.
- After thorough discussion, the members proposed that this amount be reallocated to them. Members agreed to extend CAERC consortium-level spending until June 2020 to use these funds to cover staffing and operational costs originally budgeted

in Fund E. This will result in an excess of 90,000 for Fund E, 2019/20, with the full 18-month range of spending for the members starting July 1 2019 and ending on December 31 2020. This amount will be added to the previously established Fund E Consortium Reallocation #1 of \$389,936 and will be distributed based on the allocation formula established in 2015. In order to participate in this Reallocation, members will need to formally opt in or opt out by email or verbally in a group meeting.

• On a motion by Sue Gilmore and seconded by Lynn Bartlett the proposed Fund E Reallocation was approved (9 in favor, 0 against).
