We continue to be impressed by the commitment and strength of all of you who do the day-to-day work and collaborate to provide education and workforce services to adult members of our communities. We have great pride in all you do, and we are excited to work together to sustain, expand, refine, and offer high-quality courses and services that provide the region's adult learners with the academic and employability skills needed to identify and meet their personal, educational, and career goals. In support of these objectives, CAERC has been working to promote adult learners' transition to secondary programs and career training pathways.

Great things have been happening in our consortium. We are excited to work with our partners to leverage support for adults in the community. We collaborated with Capital Impact to present at a professional learning event for Legislative staff hosted by Charles A. Jones Career and Education Center. We successfully established a CANVAS Workgroup to support members participating in the California Distance Learning Cooperative and strengthen student support and the development of courses (see page 3).

Our members worked together as they prepared their applications for WIOA II funds and were granted supplemental funding to support their programs. We also partnered with Los Rios to provide outreach and admission one-on-one assistance and registration sessions at San Juan Adult School, Elk Grove Adult and Community Education, Galt Adult School, and Twin Rivers Adult School to provide access to English as Second Language and High School Diploma students. High School Diploma students who chose to register enrolled in an HCD 310 College Success or a SPEECH 362 Mediated Communication Experience course.

In this issue, we are happy to share more about the activities, accomplishments, outcomes, and successes of adult learners in our region.

# FROM THE ANNUAL PLAN

### New CAERC Canvas Workgroup Supports Annual Plan

More than a dozen educators and support staff have signed up to participate in CAERC's newest workgroup dedicated to implementing the Canvas® Learning Management System at their agencies. The efforts of the workgroup support CAERC's Regional Strategy 4 to align and strengthen the development of courses to increase transitions from basic to secondary education, enable the use of Canvas® across the consortium, and collaborate with members participating in the California Distance Learning Cooperative.

Facilitating CAERC's Canvas® Workgroup is Miranda Currie from Elk Grove Adult and Community Education (EGACE). Her experience utilizing Canvas as an MA student at Sacramento State and an ESL instructor at EGACE makes her the ideal subject-matter expert to lead the group. OTAN trainers provide additional support via hands-on presentations, resources, and tech support.


The workgroup meets quarterly for 2-hour sessions to share best practices, assess member needs, identify goals, and share and develop resources. At the February 24 workgroup meeting, participants listened to Lana Fong, from Sacramento City Charles A. Jones Career and Education Center, share her approach to implementing Canvas® with the school's Pharmacy Technician Program. In addition to Lana's presentation, participants worked in breakout groups to either create a home page for their course or learn about Google Integration. The afternoon ended with an open Q&A session and a troubleshooting discussion among the participants.

What's next? The CAERC Canvas® Workgroup will reconvene in late Spring to share their implementation progress and creations and to plan for the 2023–24 program year.







### **Academic Infographic**



### Folsom Cordova Adult Education

#### **HSE Student Profile: Ageev Kiril**

Before immigrating with his family to the United States, Ageev Kiril was a forensic scientist (Dr. Kiril). As he became a resident of the United States, Kiril found that he could not resume his former work without an American diploma.

He and his family (wife and three children) settled in the Sacramento area, then moved to Utah and back to California as Dr. Kiril

found various jobs (including delivering pizza) until becoming a truck driver and settling in Folsom, California.

Not satisfied with driving a truck and the long hours that have taken him away from his family, Ageev started the process of getting his high school equivalency. That process began last spring and continued into our fall semester when Dr. Kiril enrolled in the HSE/HiSET preparation class in the morning with us here at FCUSD Adult Education.

By January of this year, Ageev had completed and passed all five HiSET tests with honors, and he is now a graduate!

In his own words: "When I passed all five exams, it was so great! It was not easy, but I made it. I felt like I fit in. I was no longer just a fresh immigrant, but a person with an American High School Diploma! Finally, I was ready to switch from just surviving a truck driving job to a job that I like, where I can use my experience, and get a job close to my original profession."

Ageev has been applying for a new position in the medical field and has interviews scheduled as we speak.



Dr. Kiril has this to say about his experience here at Folsom Cordova Adult School:

"When I passed all five exams, it was so great... Finally, I was ready to switch from just surviving a truck driving job to a job that I like, where I can use my experience, and get a job close to my original profession." – Dr. Ageev Kiril "Folsom Cordova Adult School helps me plan perfectly. It was an easygoing process. When I was missing classes because of my job schedule, my teacher was understanding, and he was always trying to help me by giving me useful online links which would help prepare me at home."

Many of our students have overcome obstacles on their individual and collective paths to succes. Dr. Ageev Kiril is one of those students, and we celebrate his success!

## **Our Consortium**

The Capital Adult Education Regional Consortium (CAERC) is a regional delivery system for adult education programs across the greater Sacramento region.

CAERC is funded through the California Adult Education Program (CAEP), a joint partnership between the California Community College Chancellor's Office (CCCCO) and the California Department of Education (CDE). CAEP funds support courses for adults in seven program areas:

- 1. English Language Learners (ESL/ELL)
- 2. Adult Basic and Secondary Education (ABE/ASE)
- 3. Career and Technical Education (CTE)
- 4. Workforce Preparation
- 5. Pre-Apprenticeship
- 6. Adults Training for Child School Success
- 7. Adults with Disabilities
